

Michigan's Natural Gas Story Origin, 80 Years History, and Future Potential

The use of 'city gas' in Michigan originated in the 1850's lighting city streets in Detroit and later Grand Rapids. Michigan's first reported natural gas well was completed in Muskegon County in 1928. Total reported Michigan natural gas production is 8.0 Tcf through 2014. This presentation will review the origins of Michigan's oil and natural gas story, changing supplies, production history and potential for the future.

Professional Summary: Douglas J. Elenbass P.E.

Doug's professional career from 1970's through the present has been devoted to the energy industry. Since 1984, the focus has been reservoir engineering in oil and gas production valuation and underground natural gas storage analysis. Doug has served on the Pipeline Research Council International – Underground Gas Storage Research Committee for 10 years, and also served as an officer for the Michigan Section of the Society of Petroleum Engineer form 1987-1993 and was awarded the SPE Mid-Continent Region Service Award in 1994. The Elenbaas family heritage has also worked the energy industry for 110 Years.
